The 1981-82 Vega basketball team can best be characterized in a single word - determination. From the very outset of the season it appeared that the Vegas would have an insurmountable task attaining any of the team goals. Only two starters returned from the previous season and no starter stood over six feet. Playing a rugged schedule consisting of the most games ever played by a Vennard team, the Vegas captured six out of twenty-nine games. Each win was a big one. In the pre-season tournament held at Vennard, the Vegas took sixth place out of eight schools. In the Iowa-Illinois League Vennard played the dark-horse role defeating all but one team and capturing an undisputed second place. In the post-season tournament Vennard brought home a third place trophy. Jon Bishop and Dave Troupe were named to the all-league team.

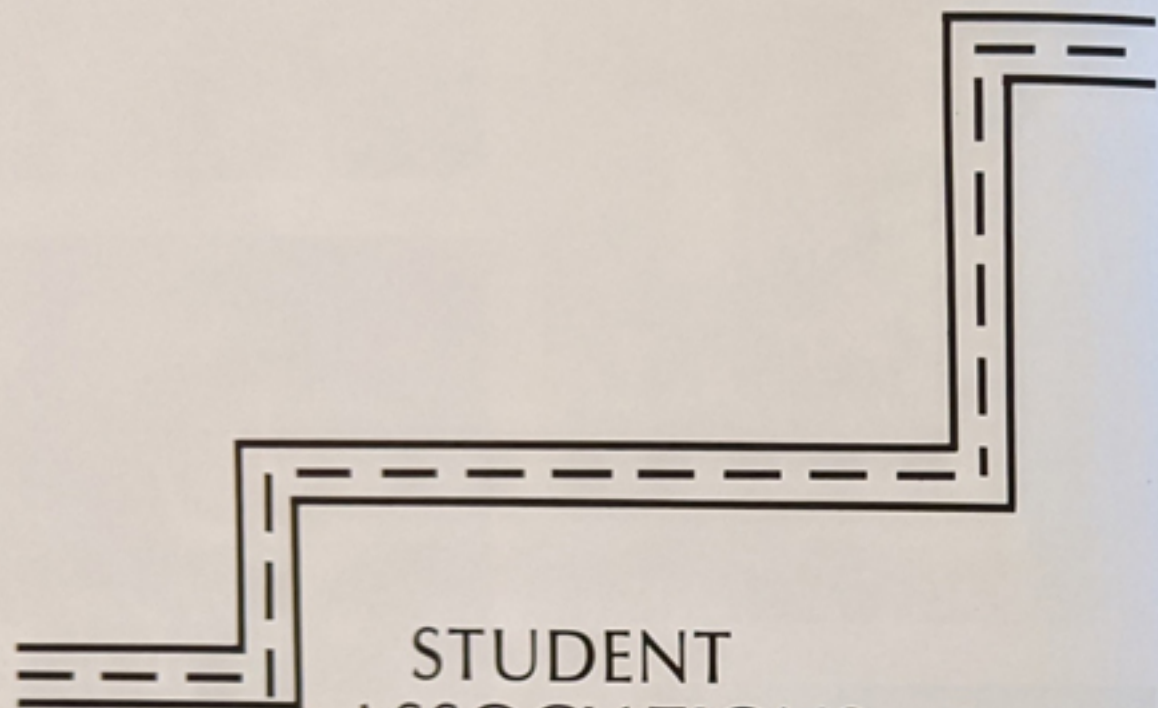
It was a year of record-breaking performances by the young Vegas: David Troupe broke the record for most points in a game (35) and in a season (350); while Jon Bishop set records for most assists (174), blocked shots (32), and steals (104) in a season; Ray Adams set a season rebounding record (258).

The highlight of the season was the team's trip to the Dominican Republic over spring break. The Vegas played seven games and shared the gospel with national teams and fans. The Vegas rolled up four victories but more important they shared the message of Christ with over 1,000 Dominicans and led several to the Lord. This was the mark of the Vegas this year - a team with a mission.

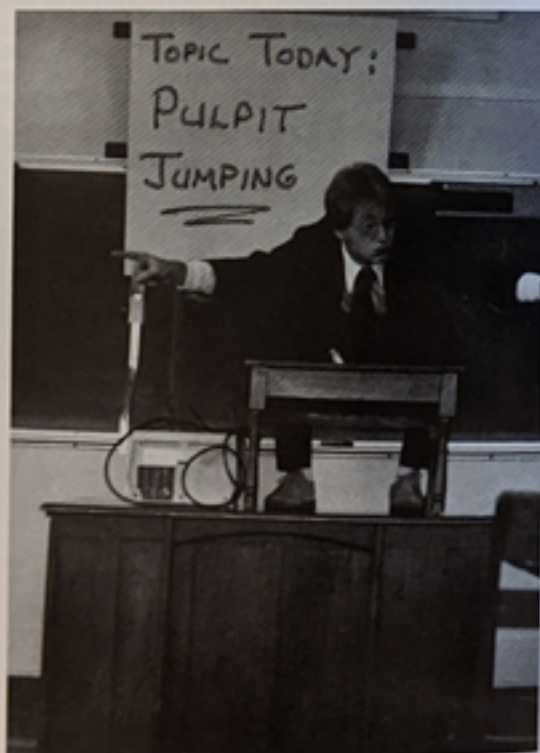
