His sincerity and integrity impacted those with whom he came in contact. The following statement exemplifies Dr. Fash's life: "Don't ever feel like you don't make a difference. The impact you have on people's lives is eternal and not easily seen." Dr. Fash's year long battle with cancer ended one Saturday in April as he slipped quietly into eternity while praying with and for his family. Thank you Dr. Fash for actively living your faith in Christ--you will be greatly missed.

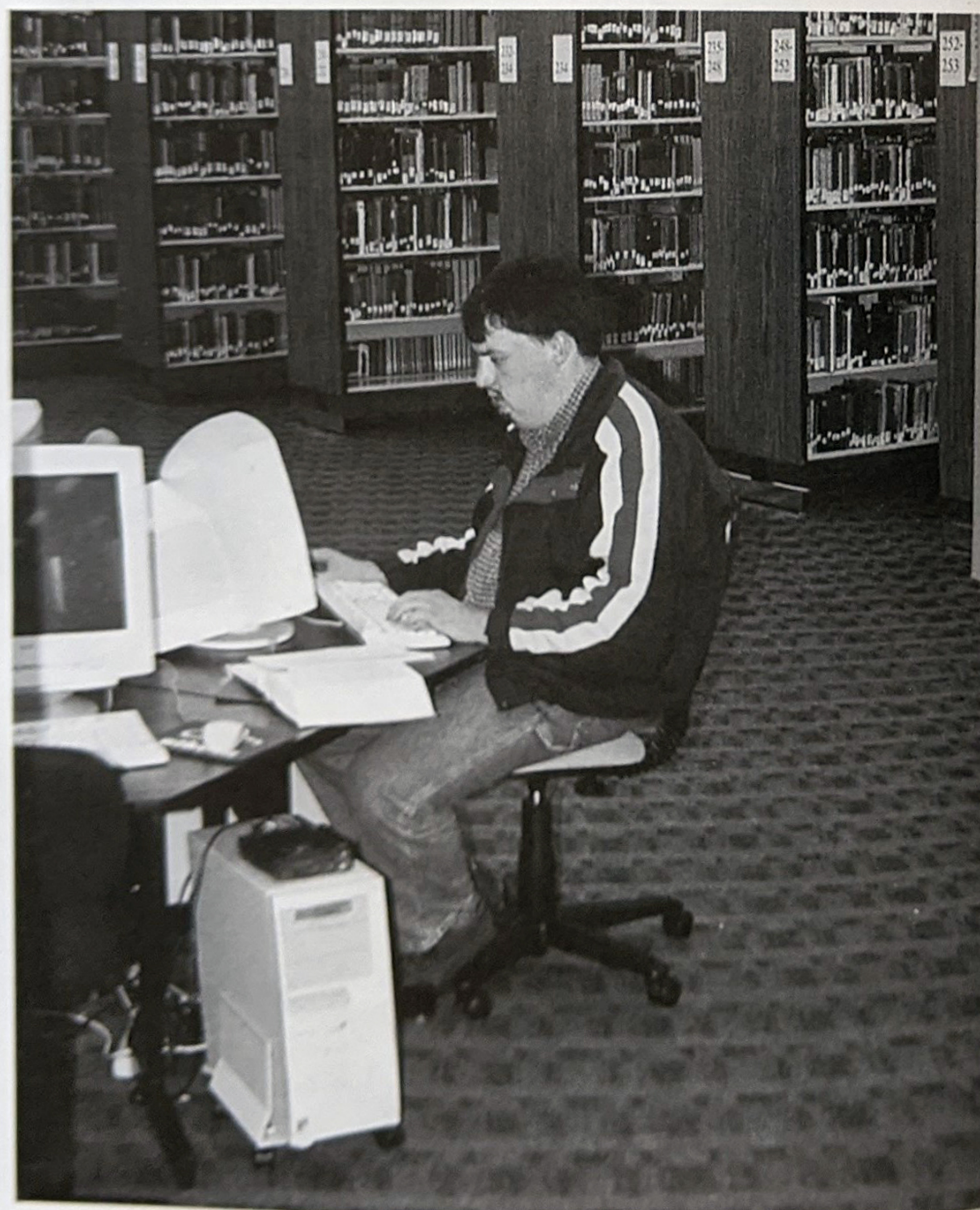

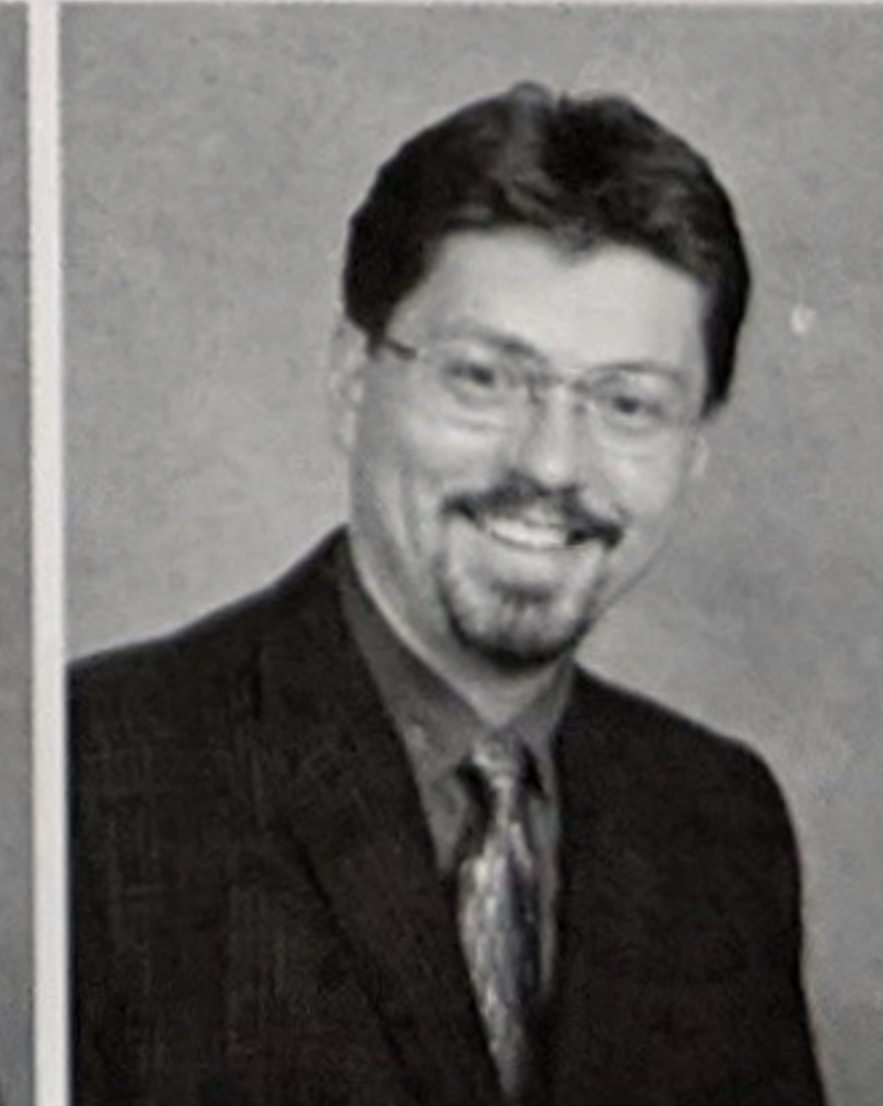
Learning from our Leaders

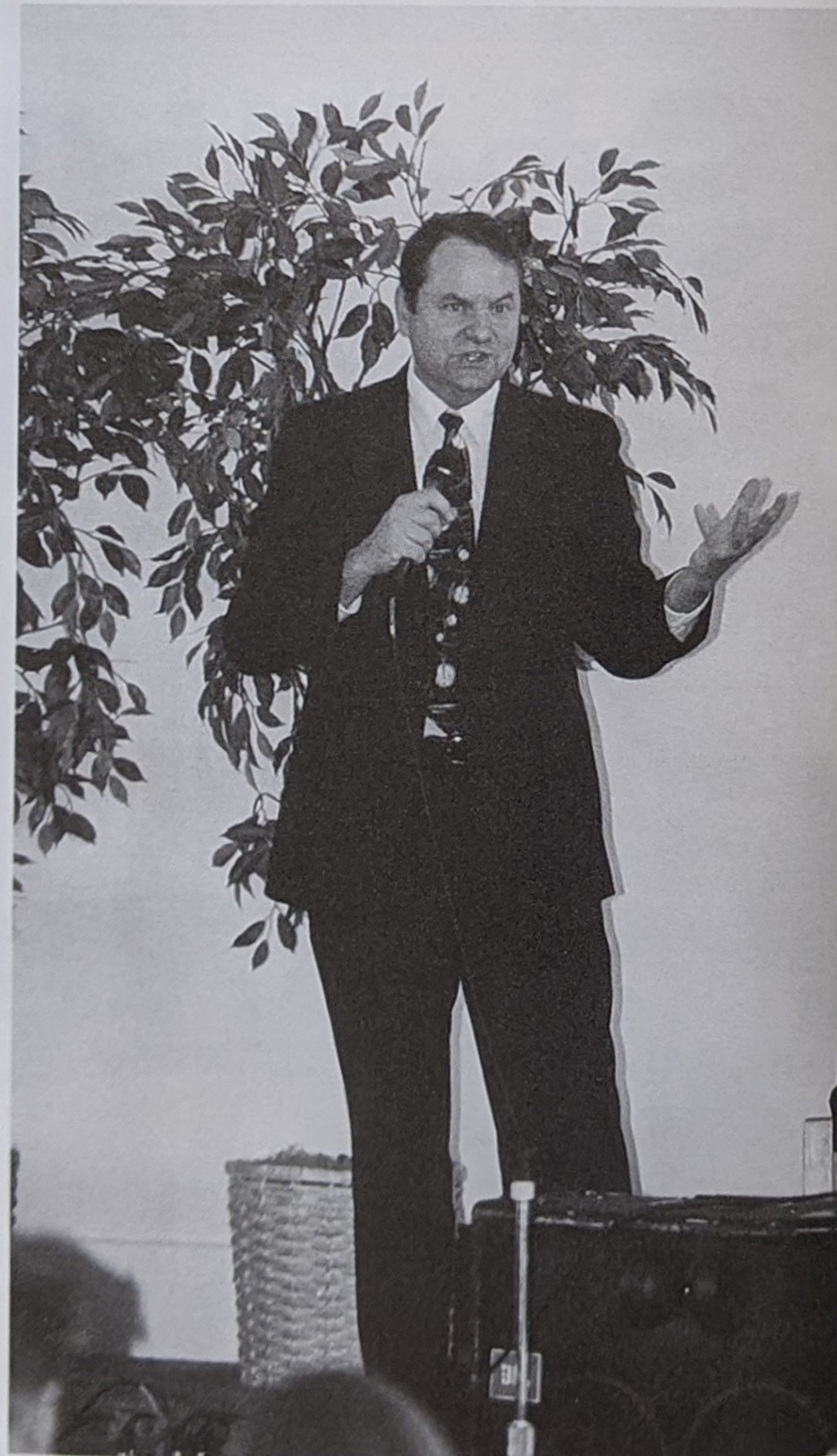

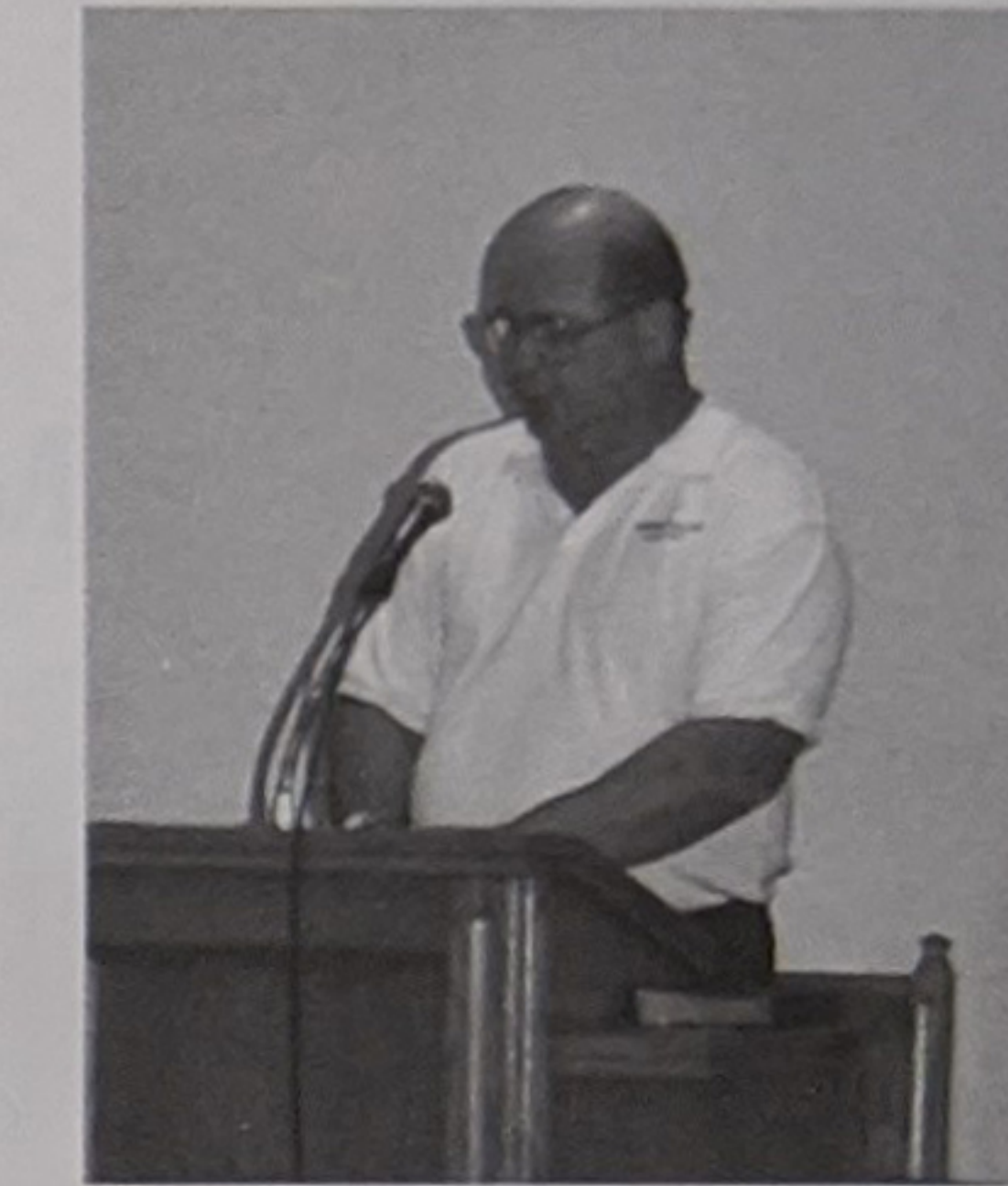

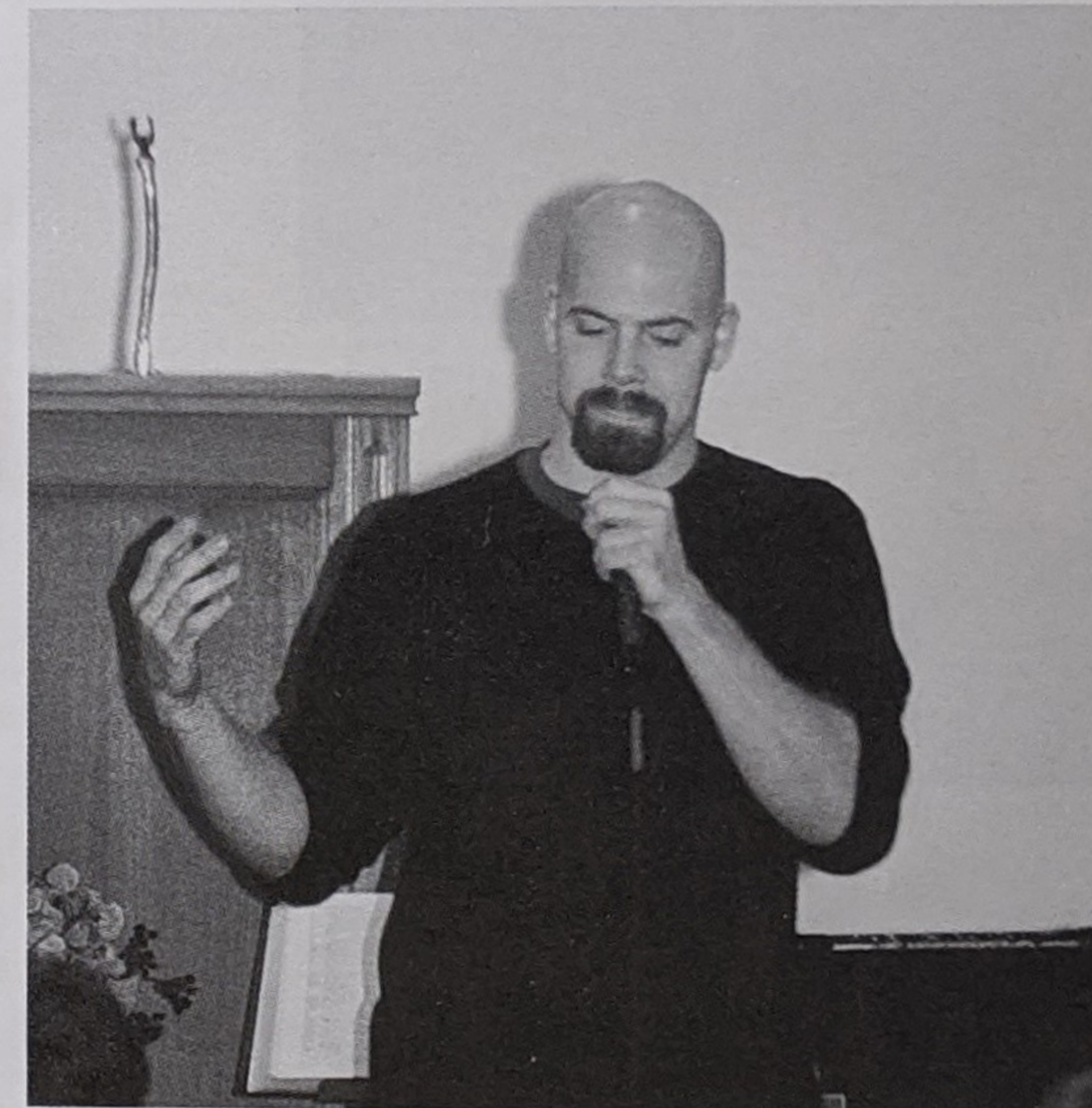

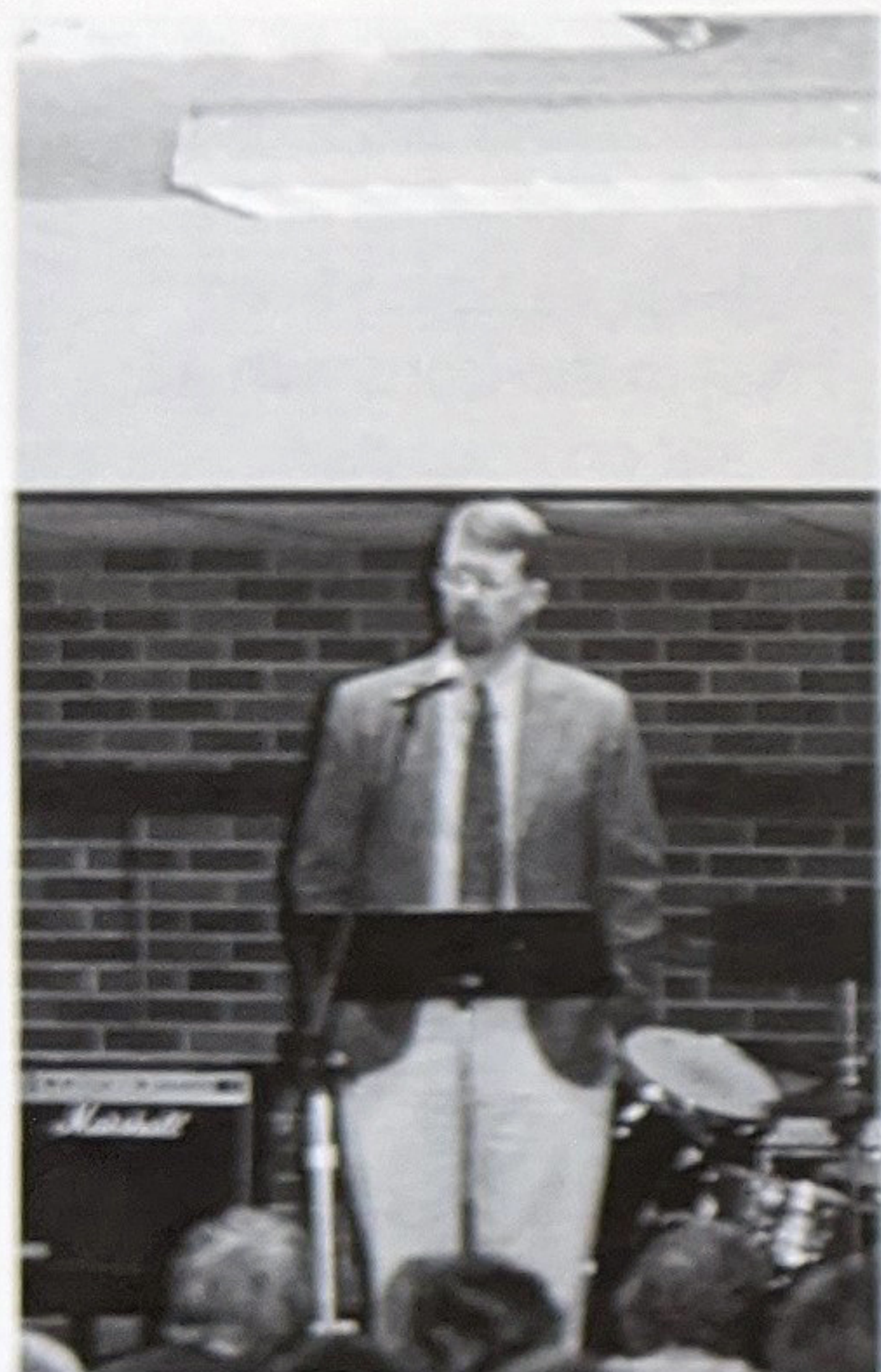


David Strong

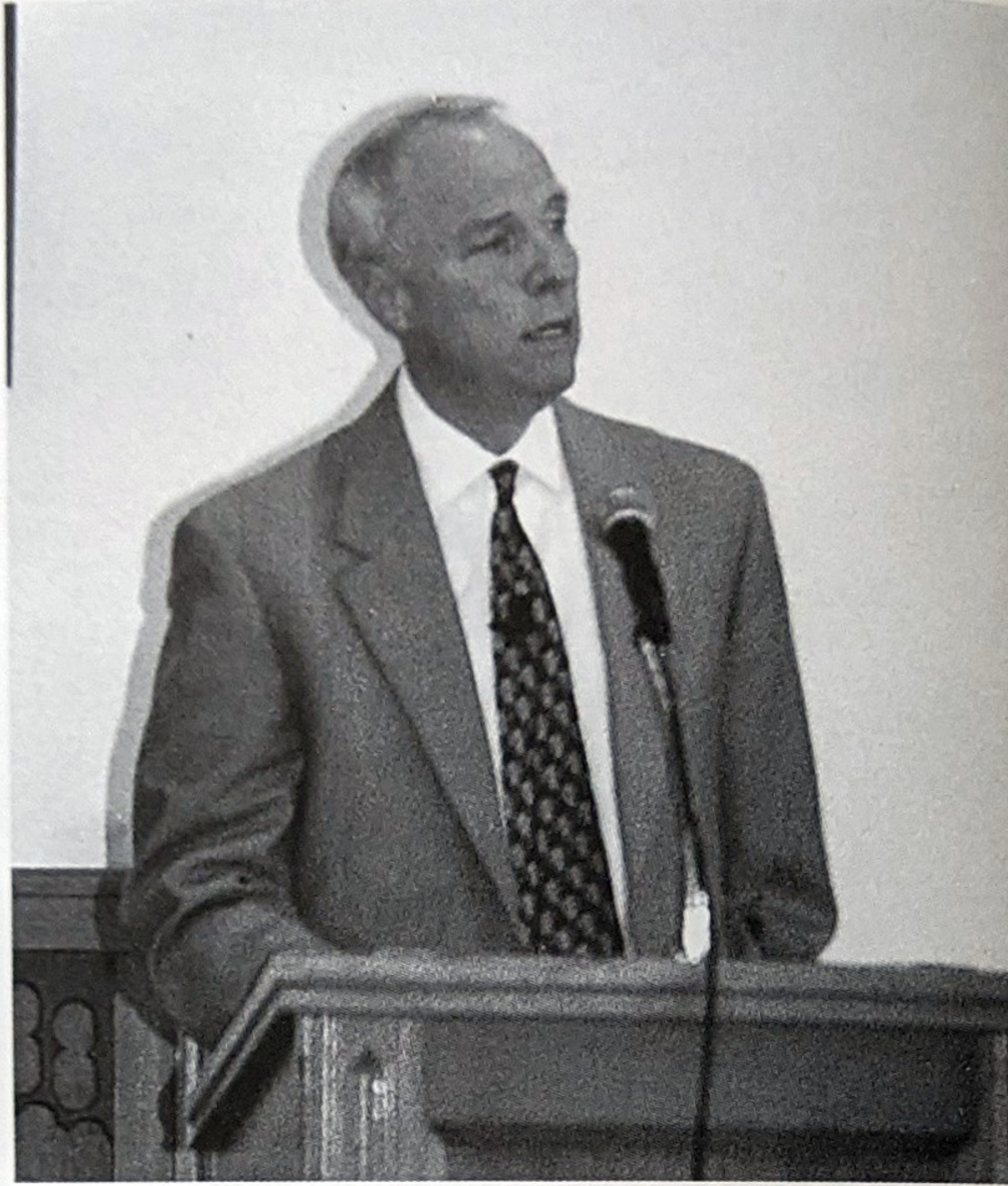

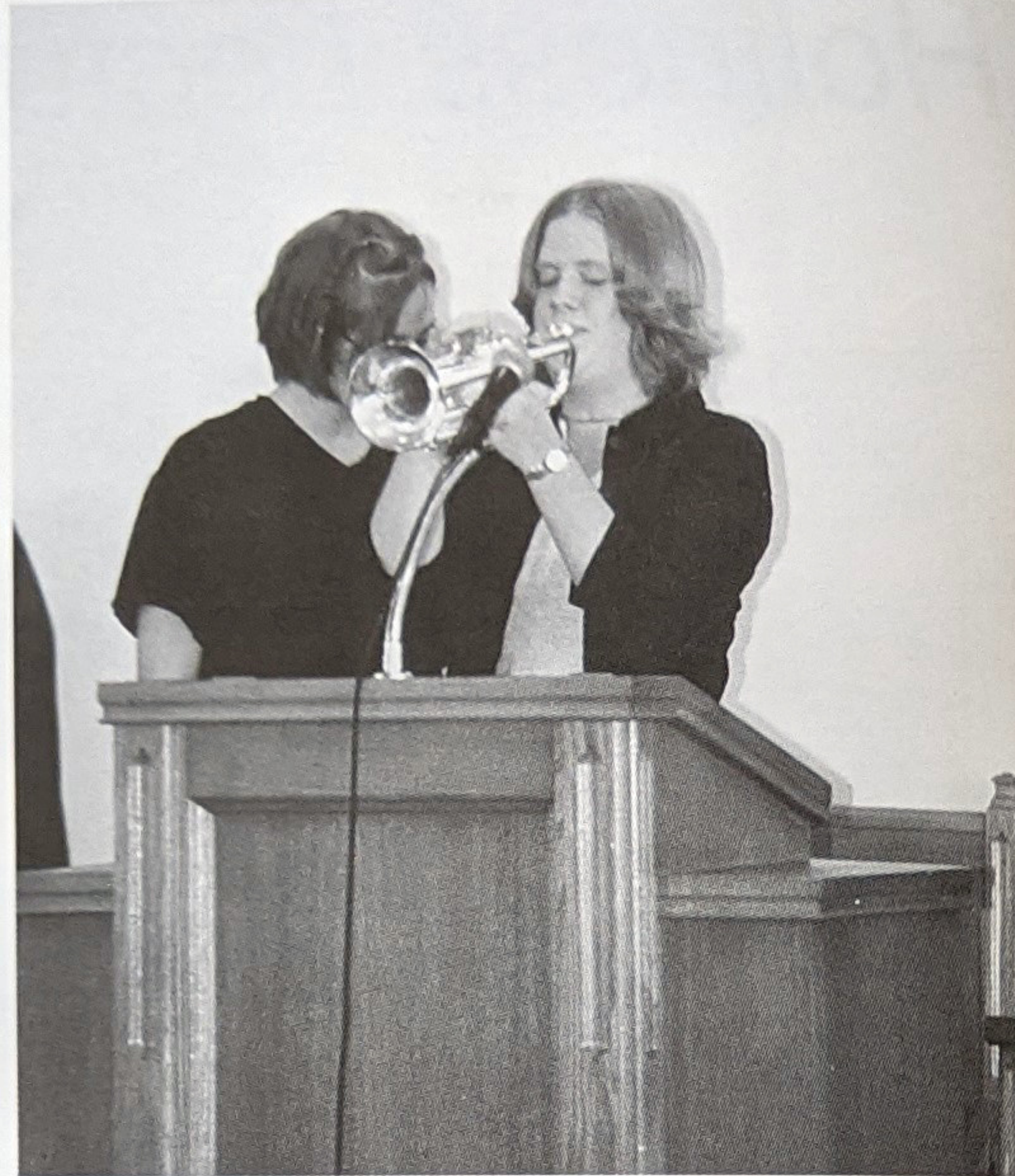
Holiness Lectures

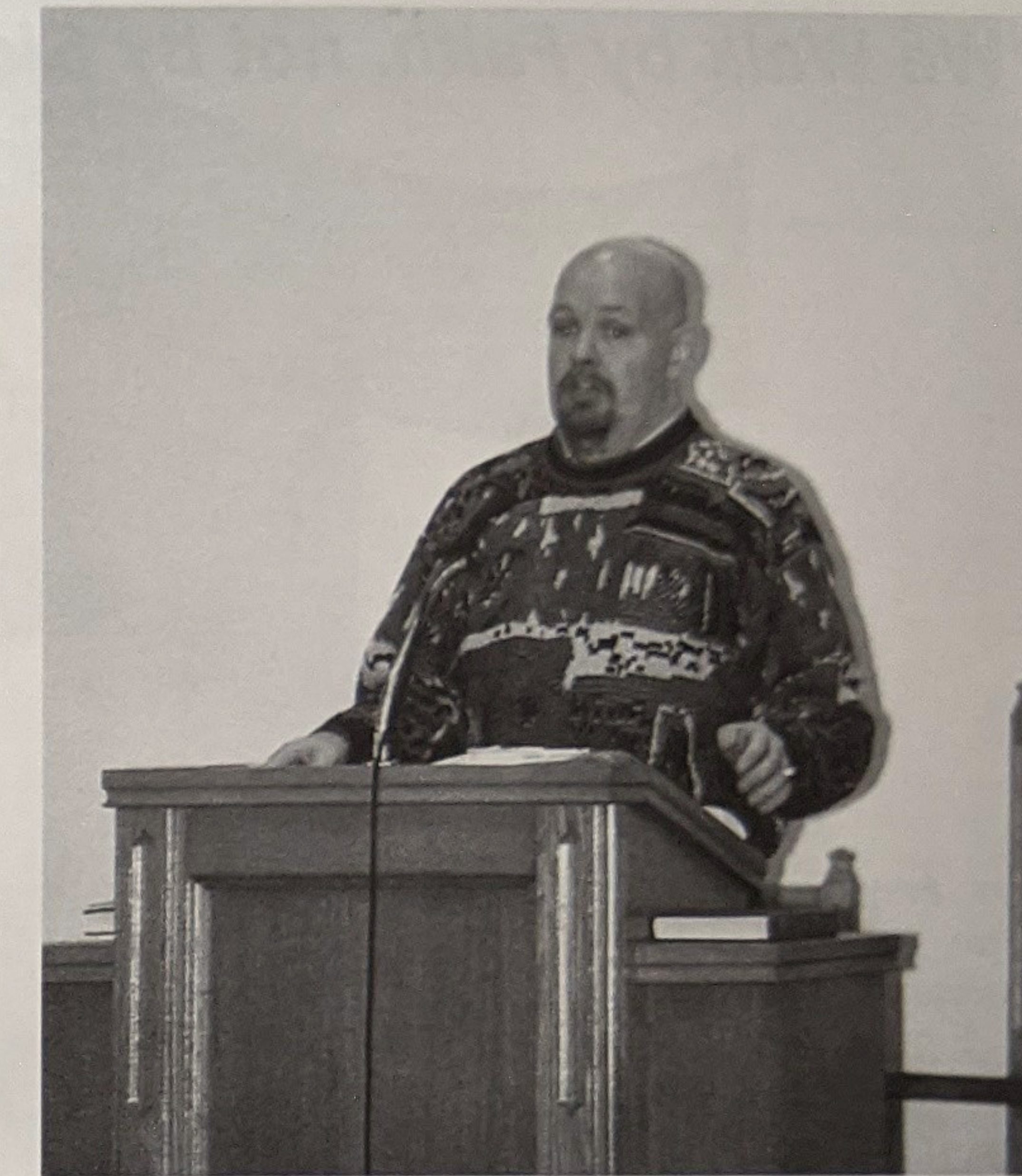

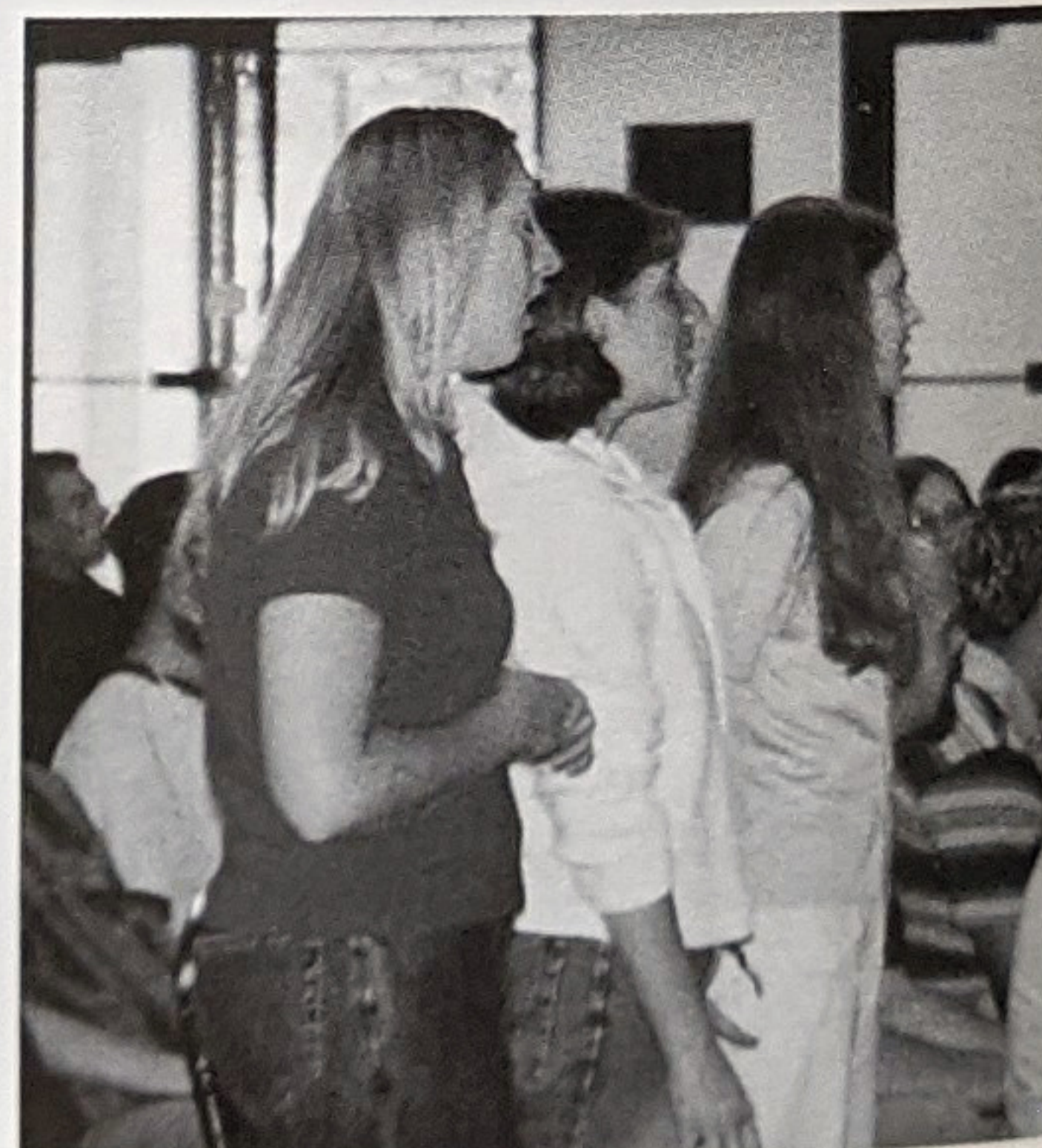

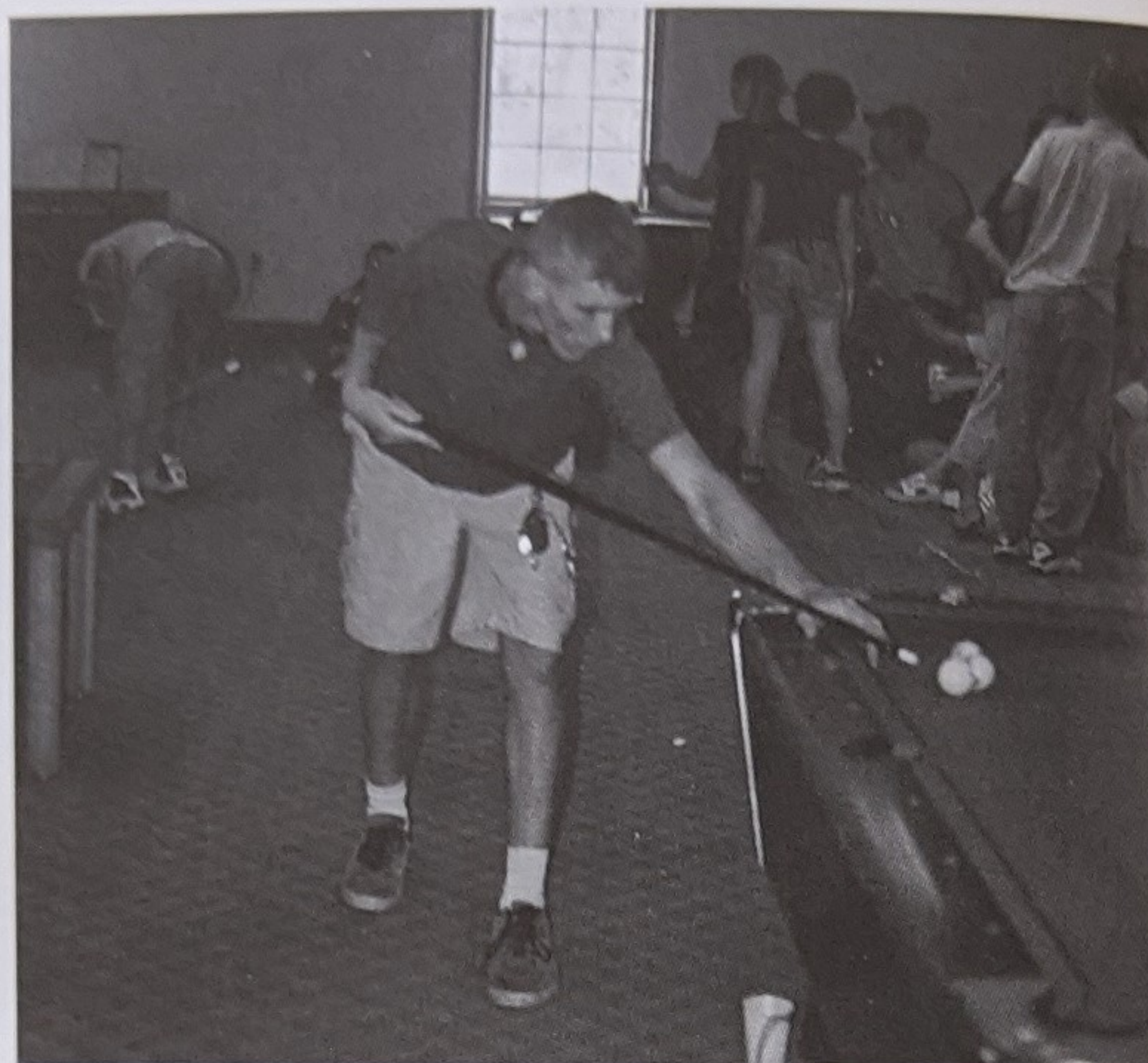

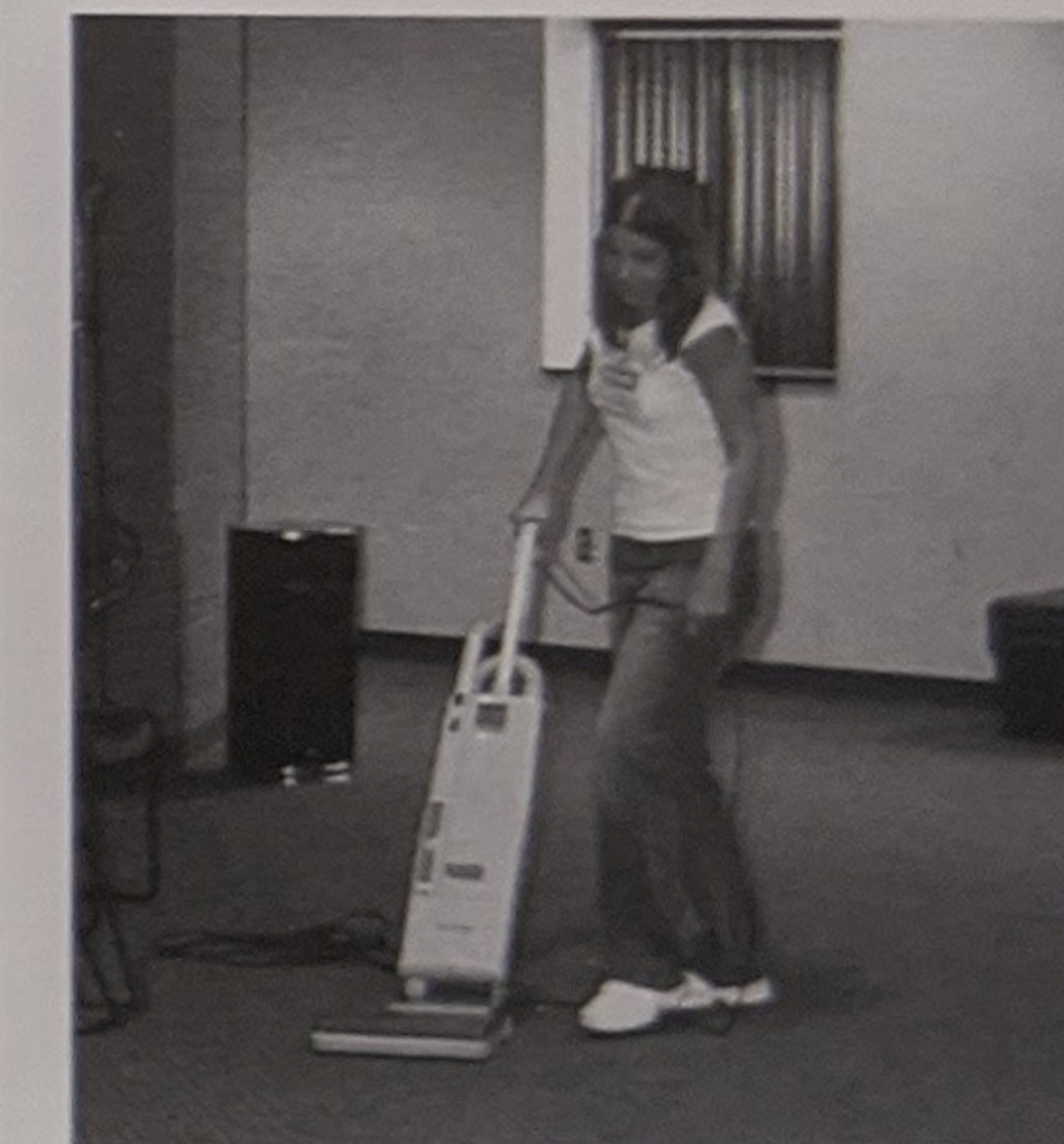

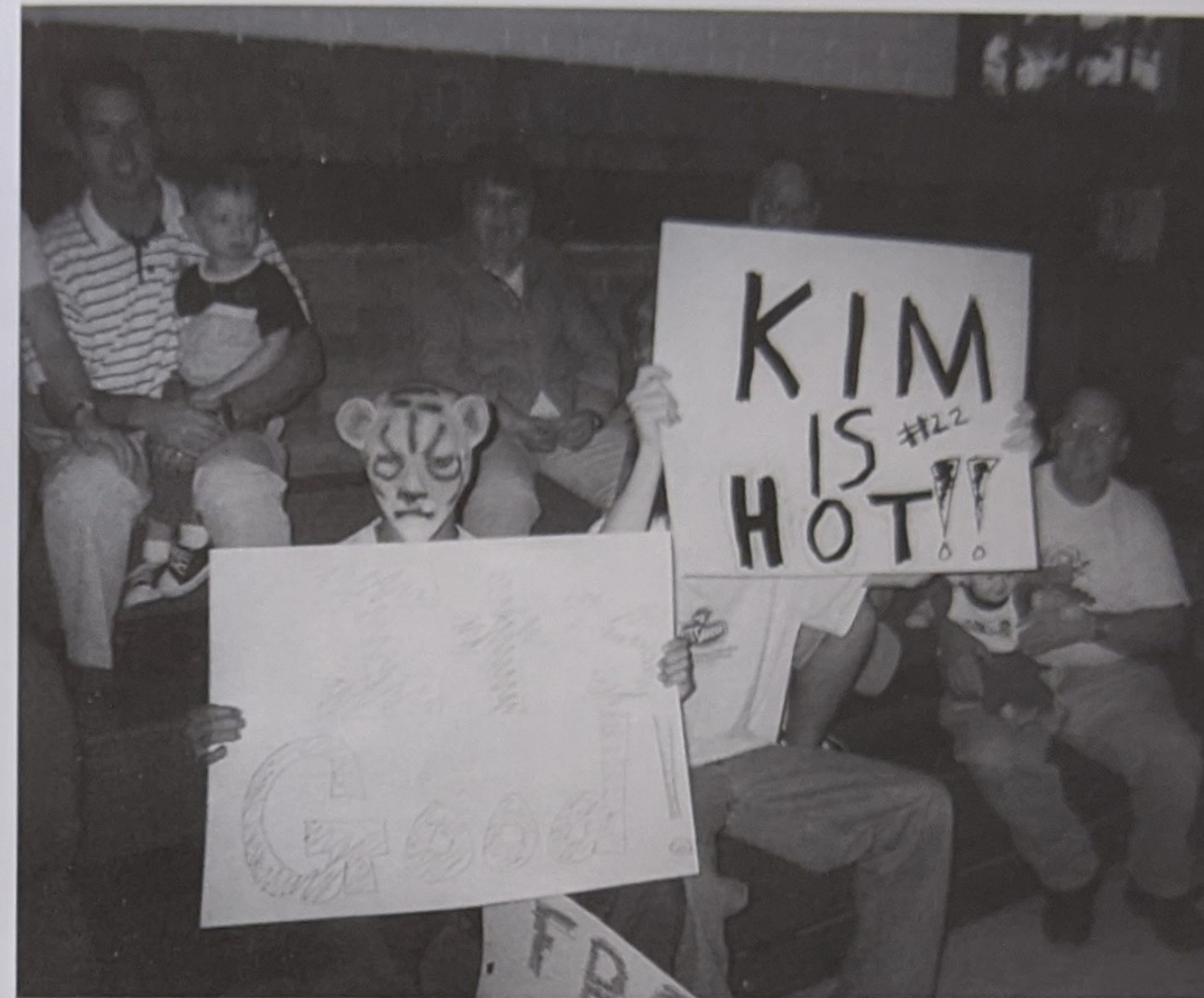

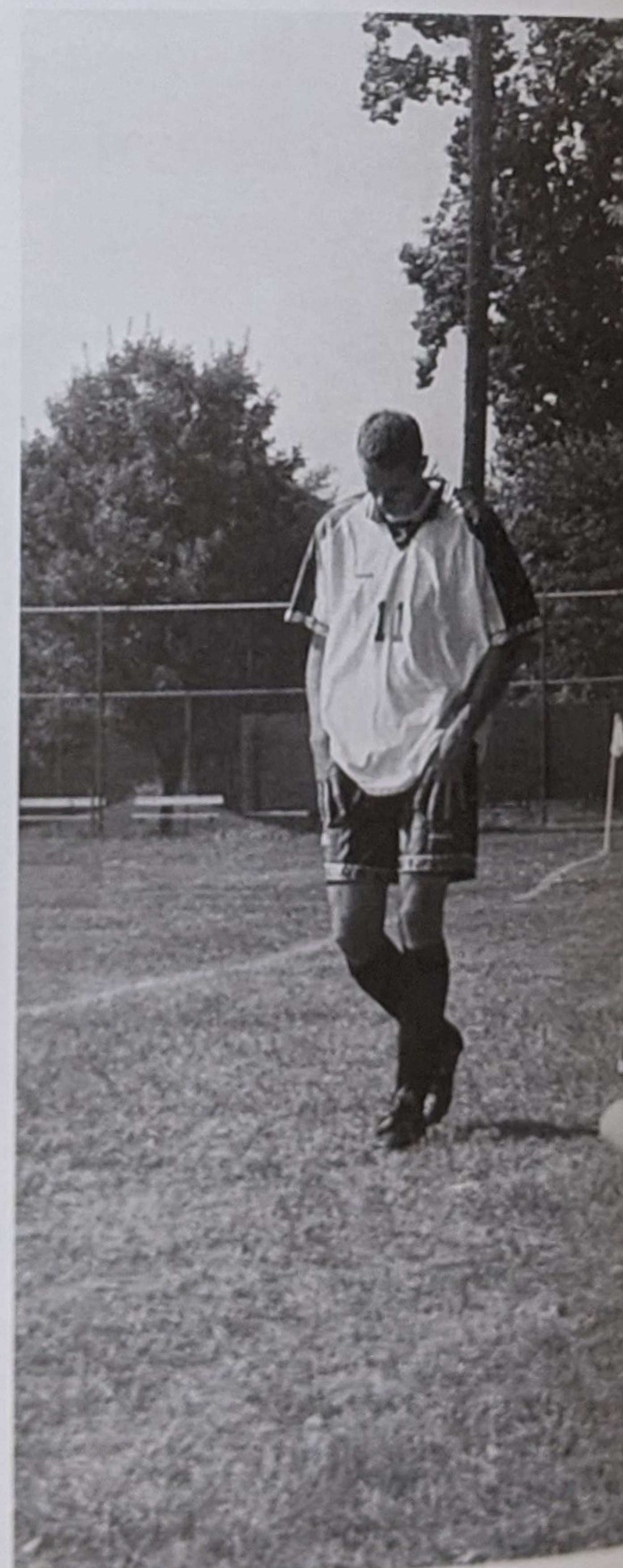

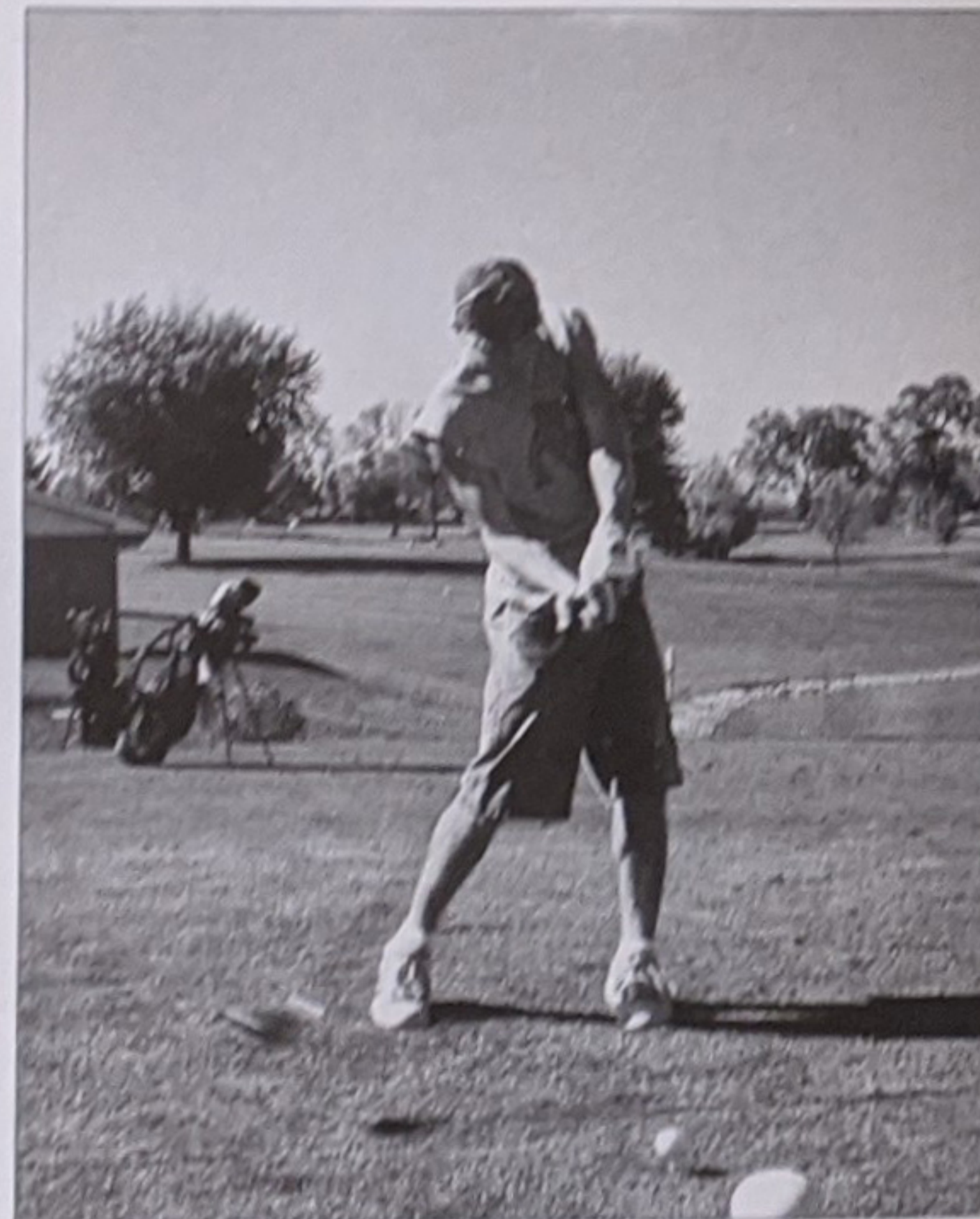

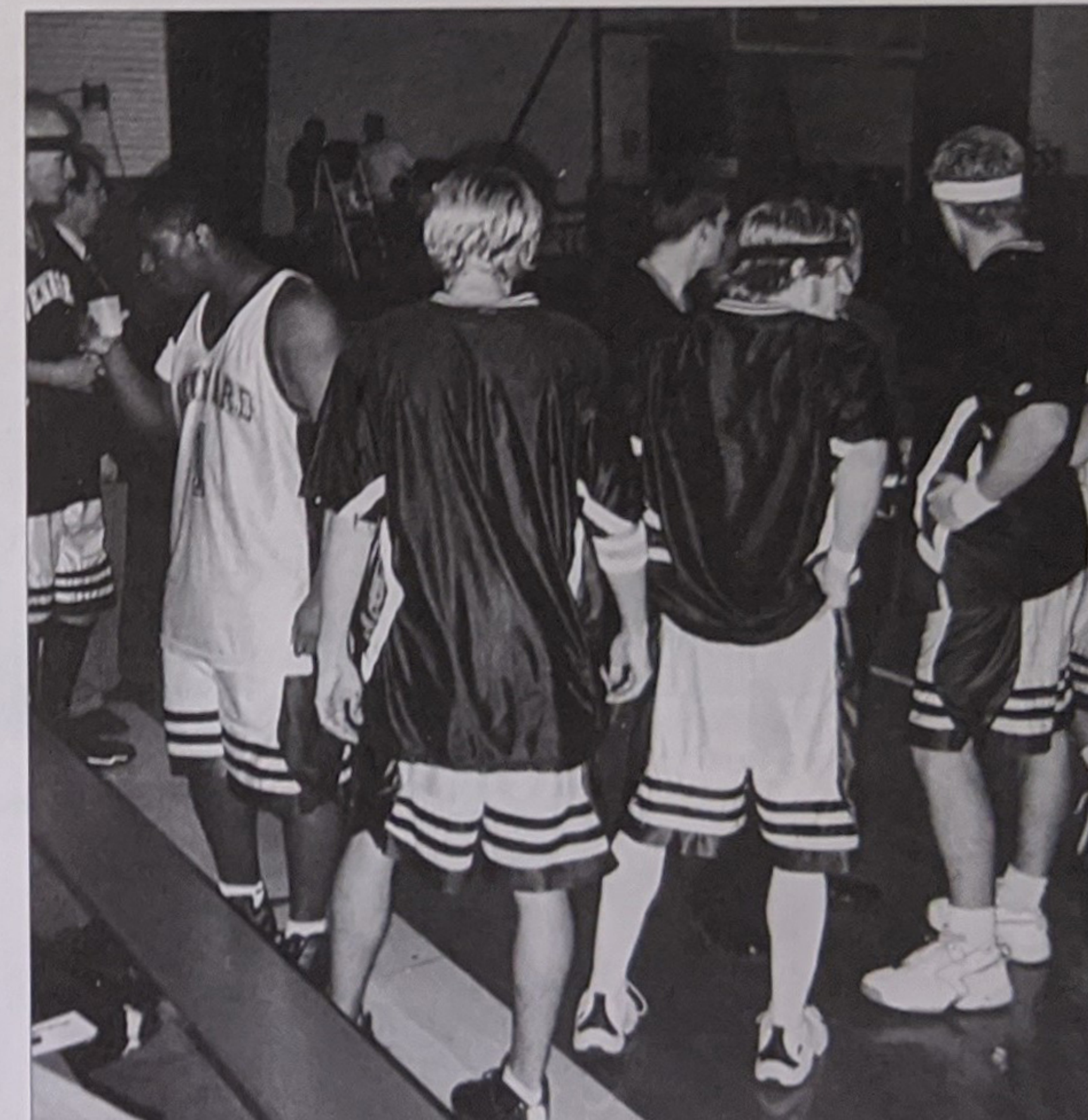

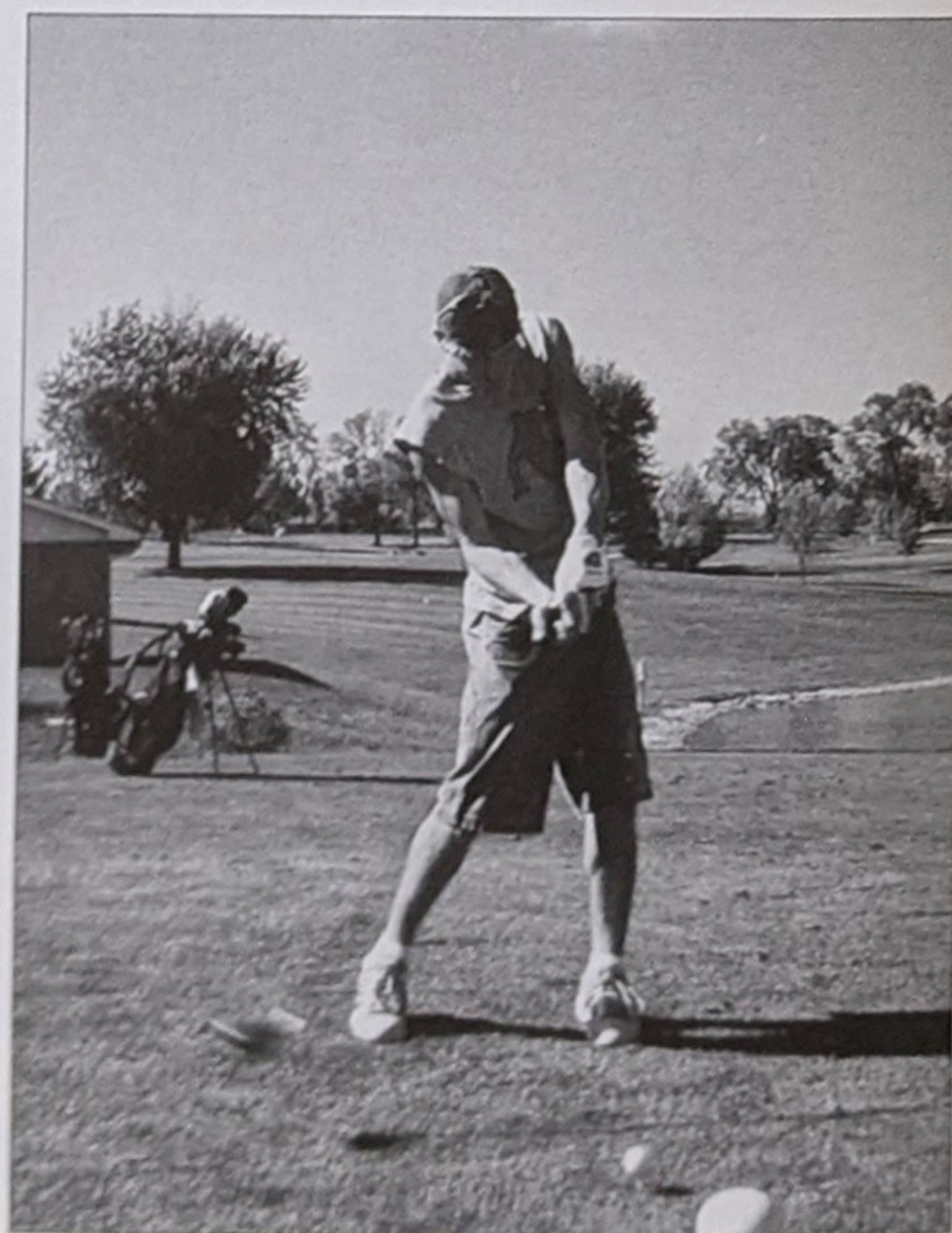

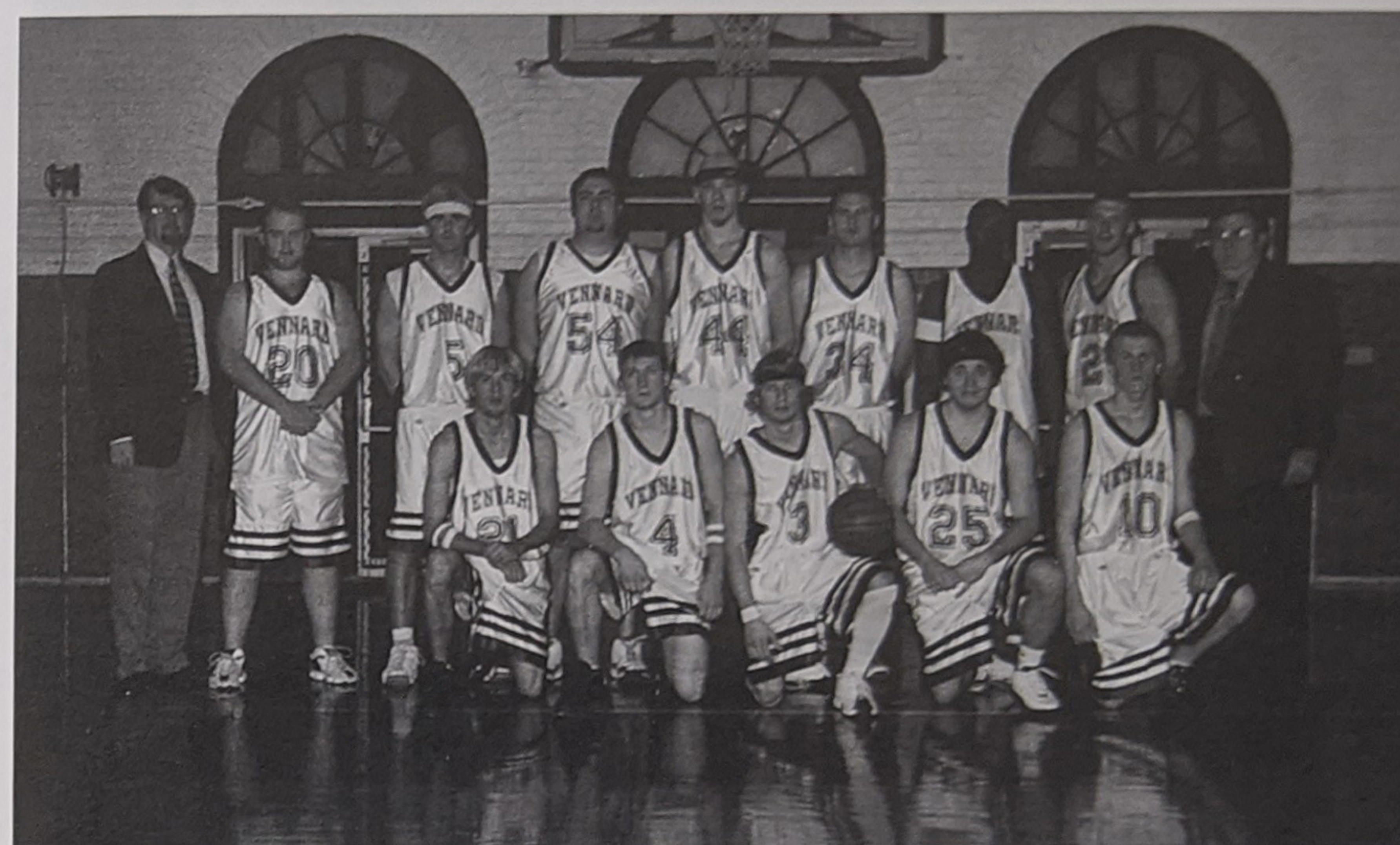

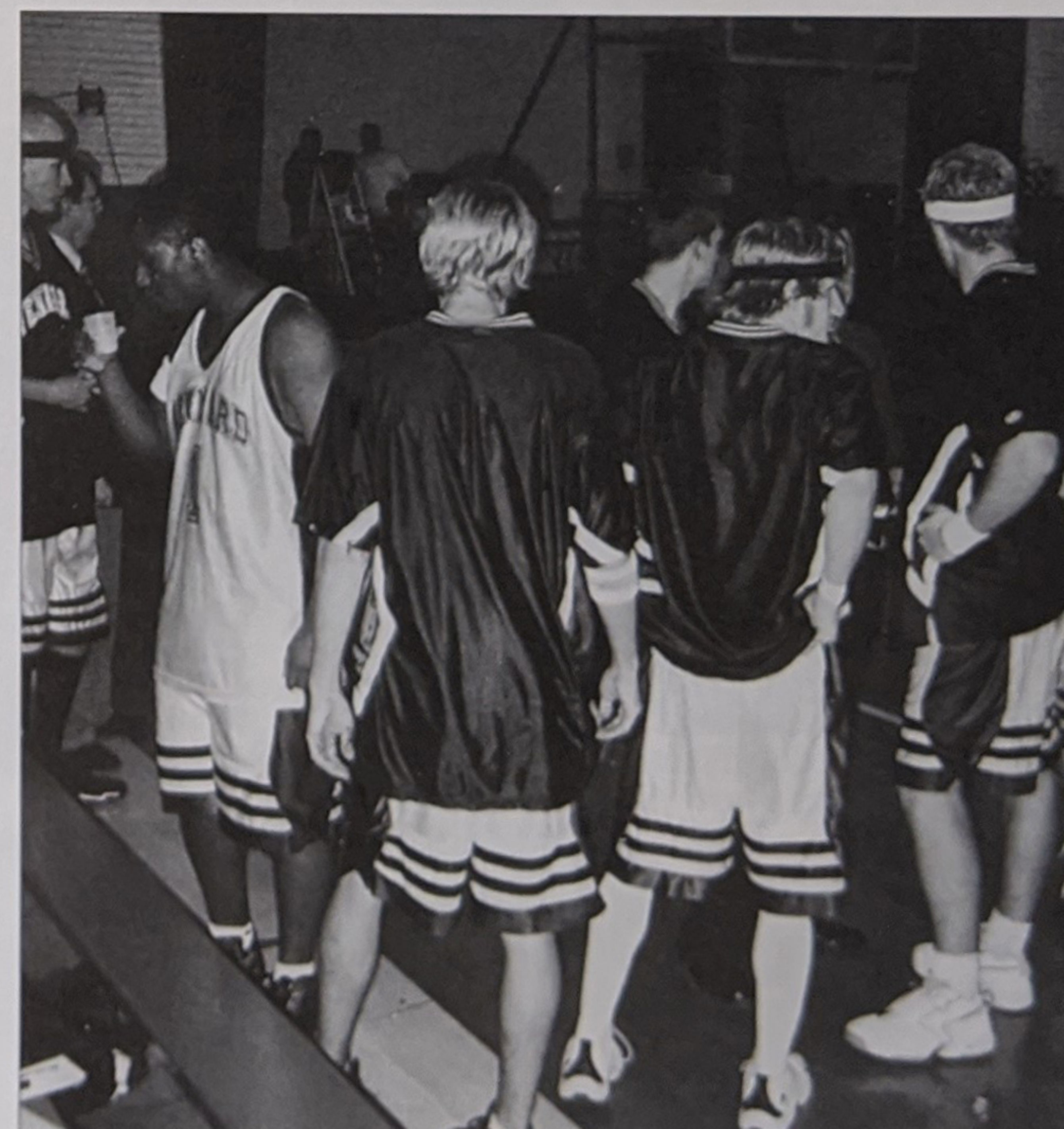

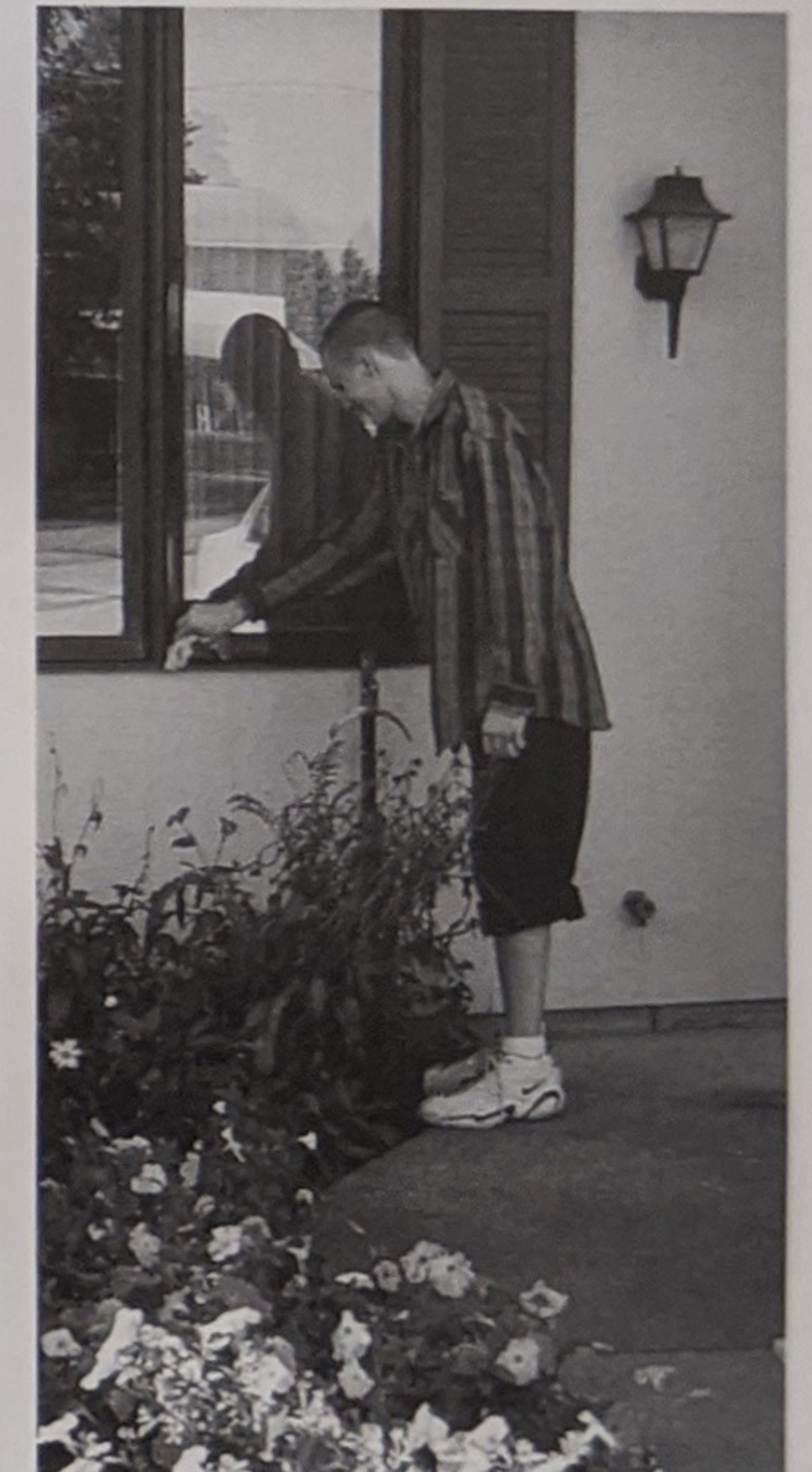

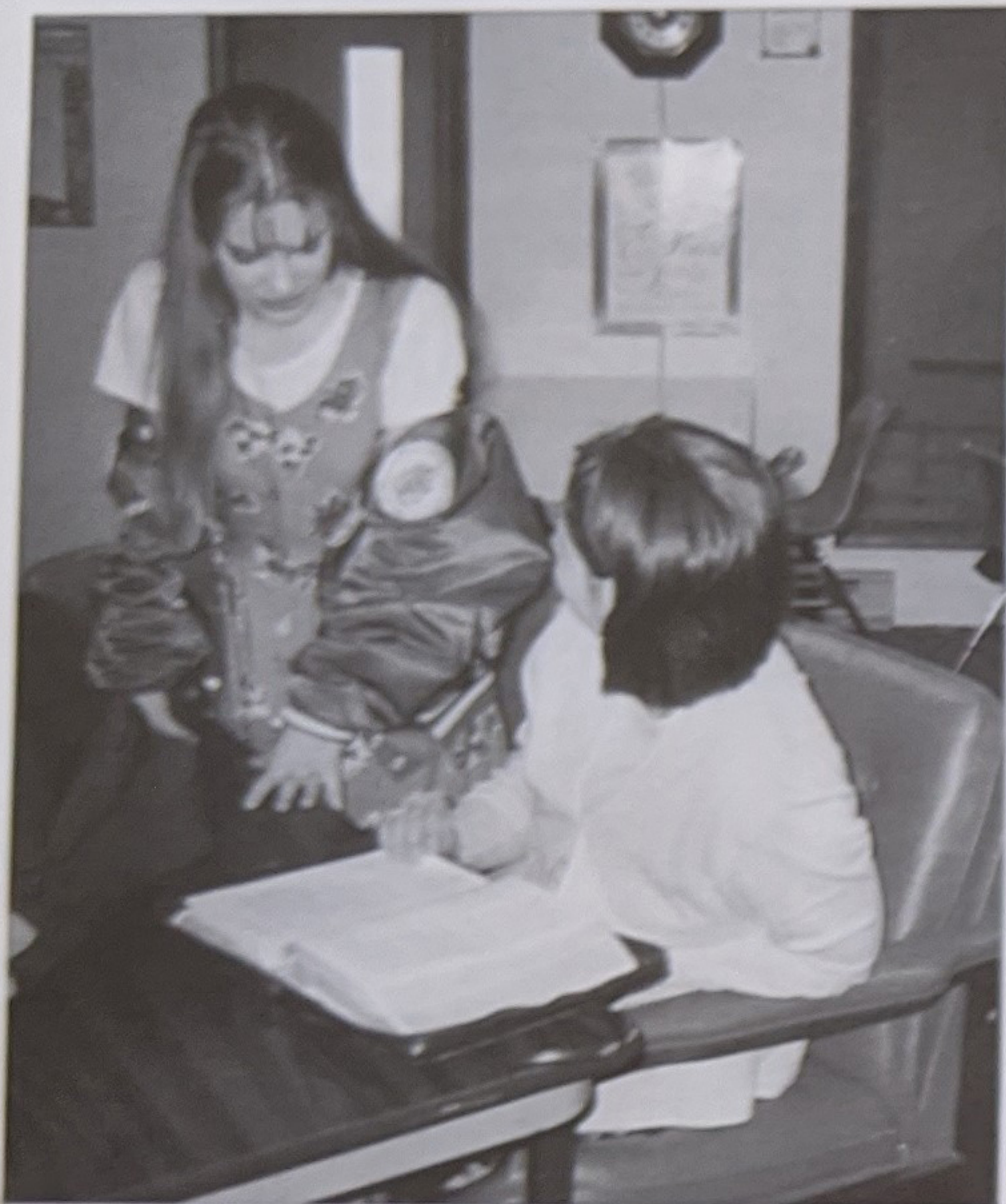

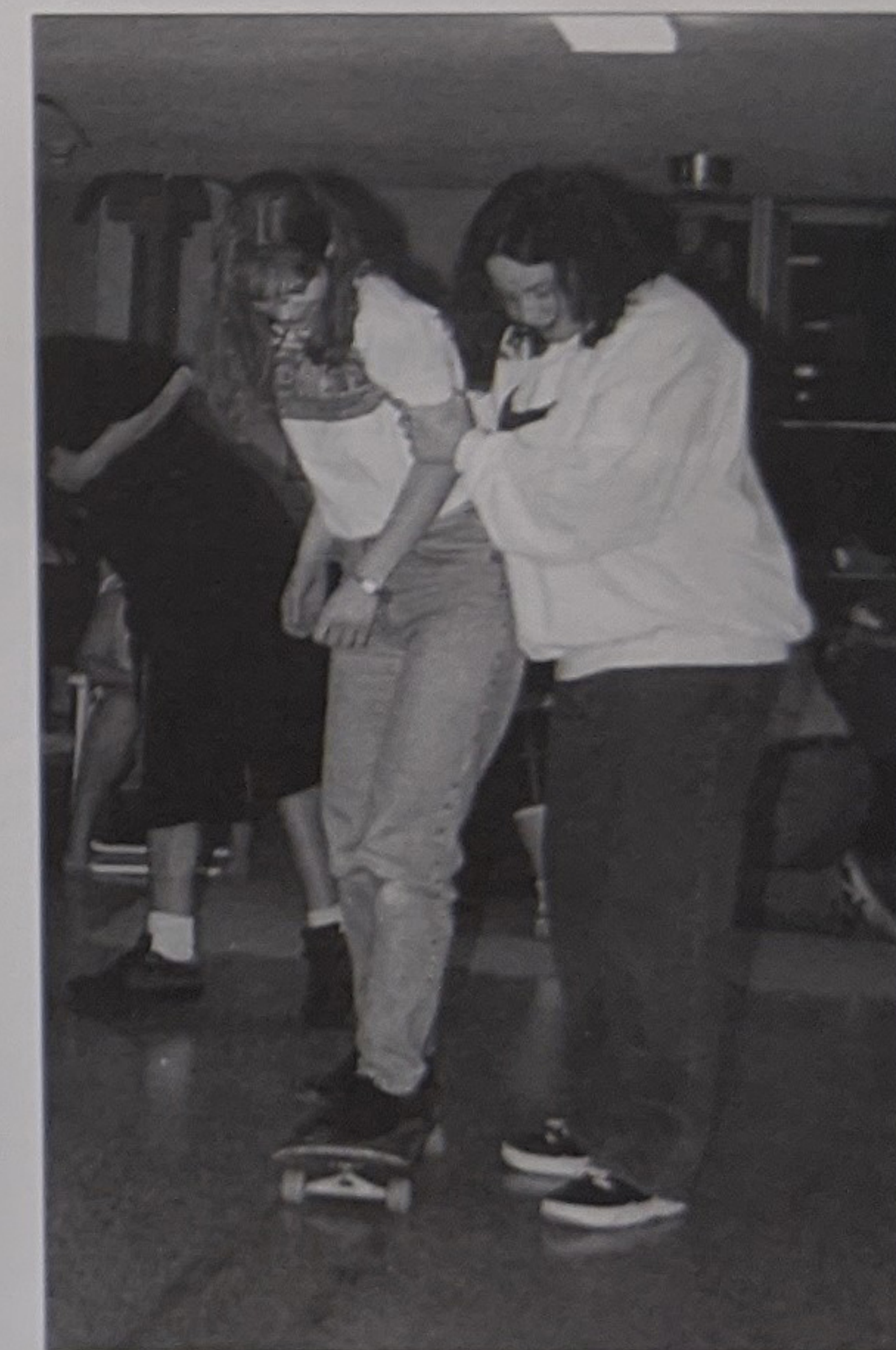

Missions on Border



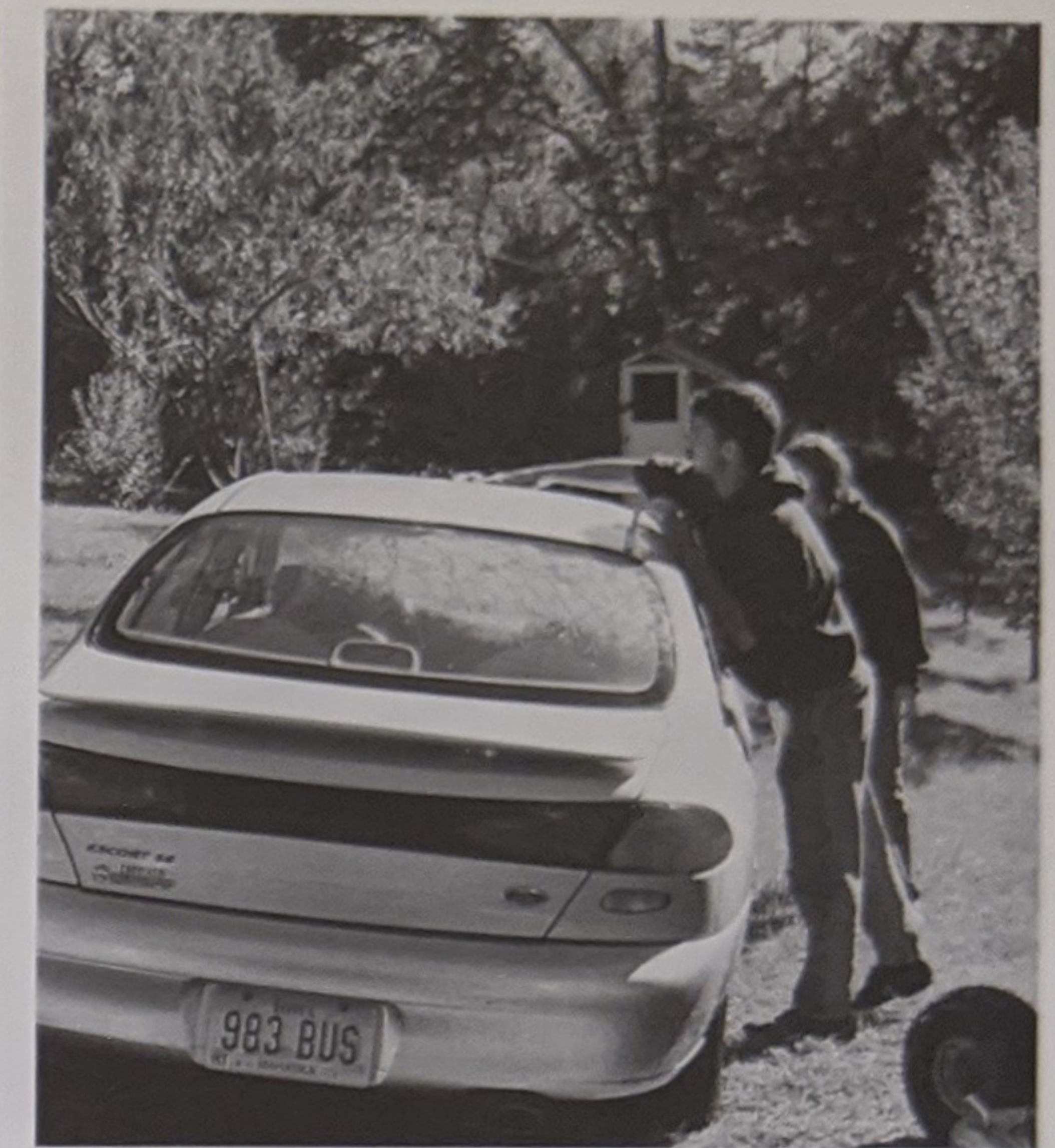

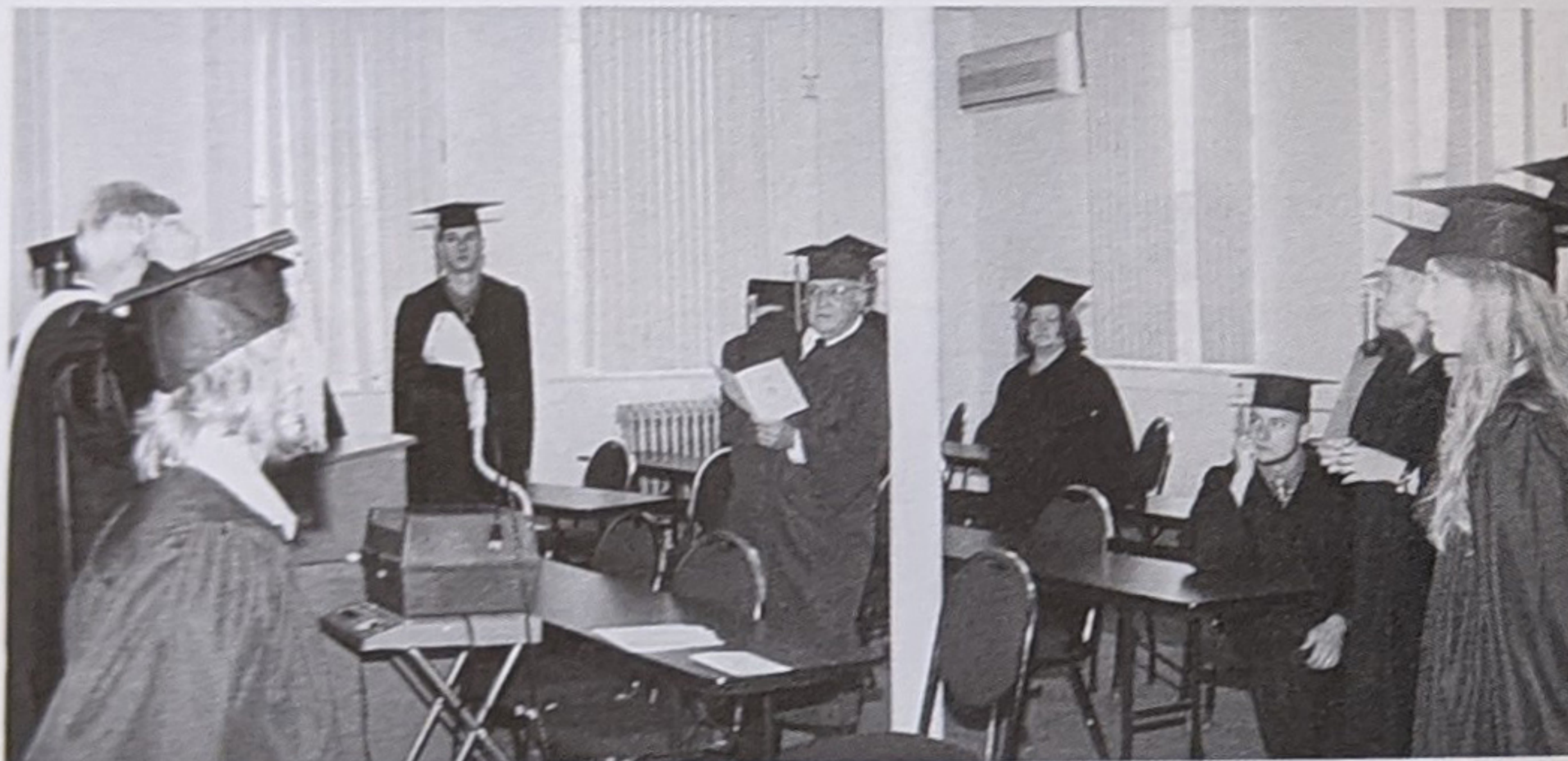

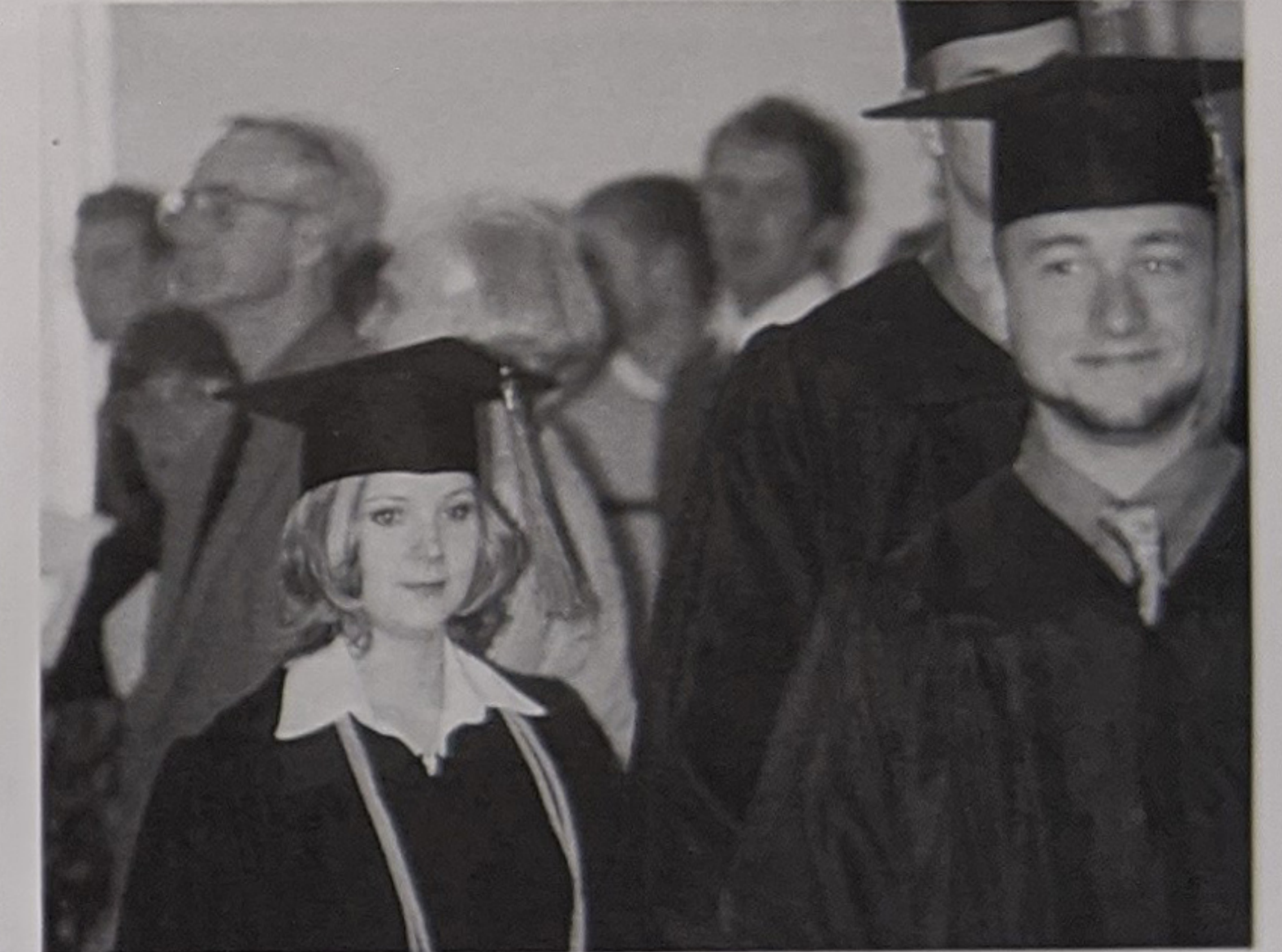

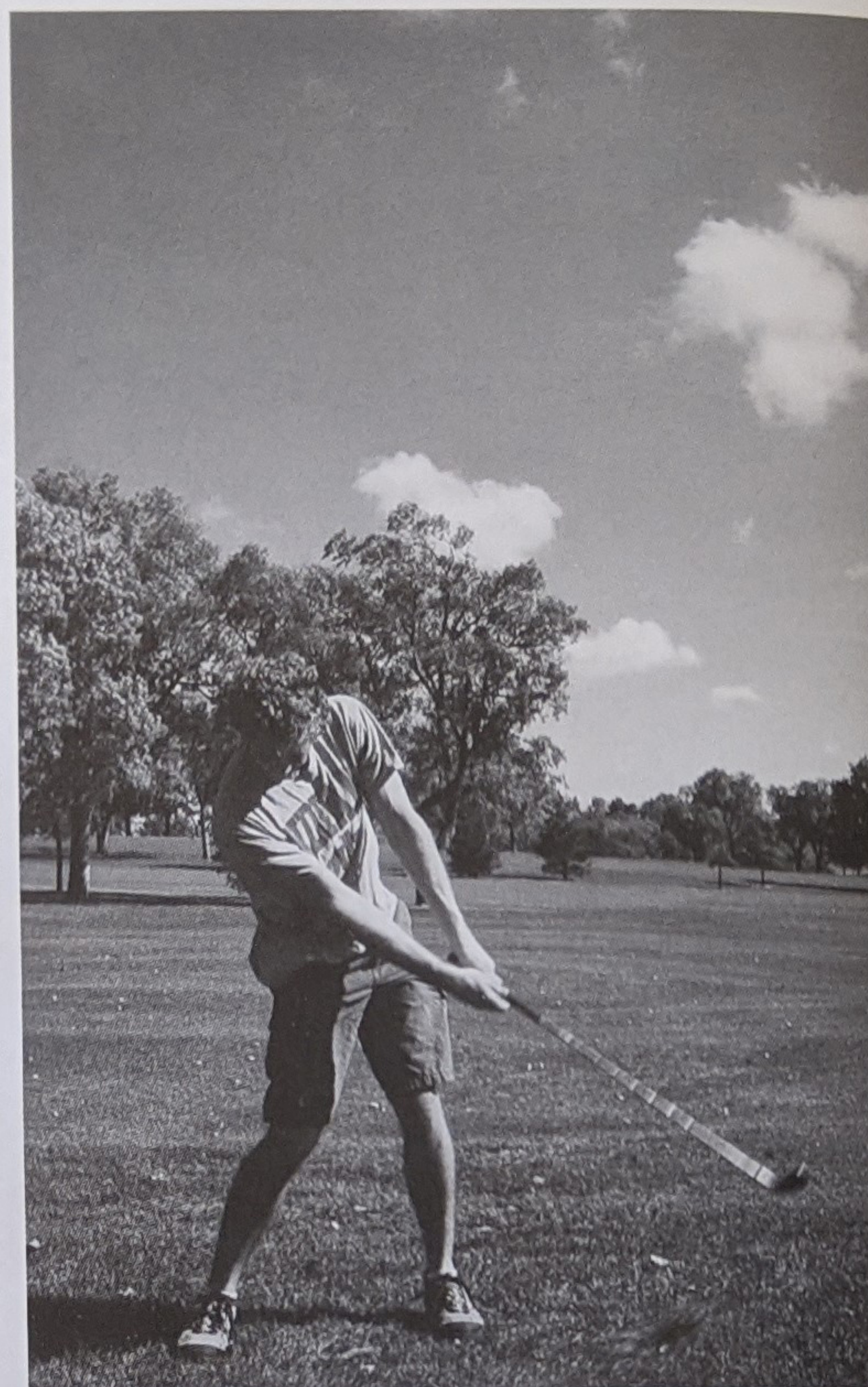

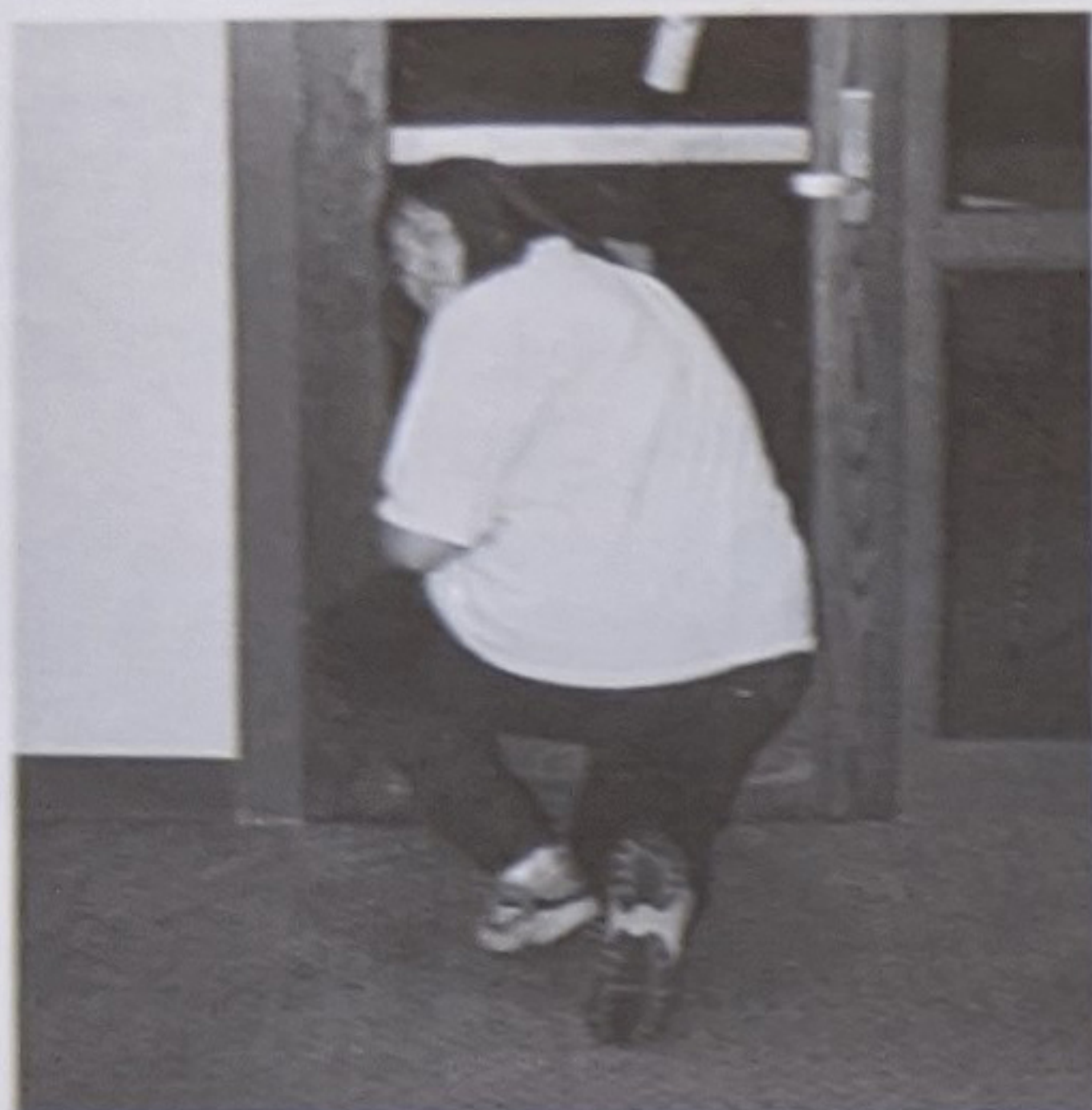

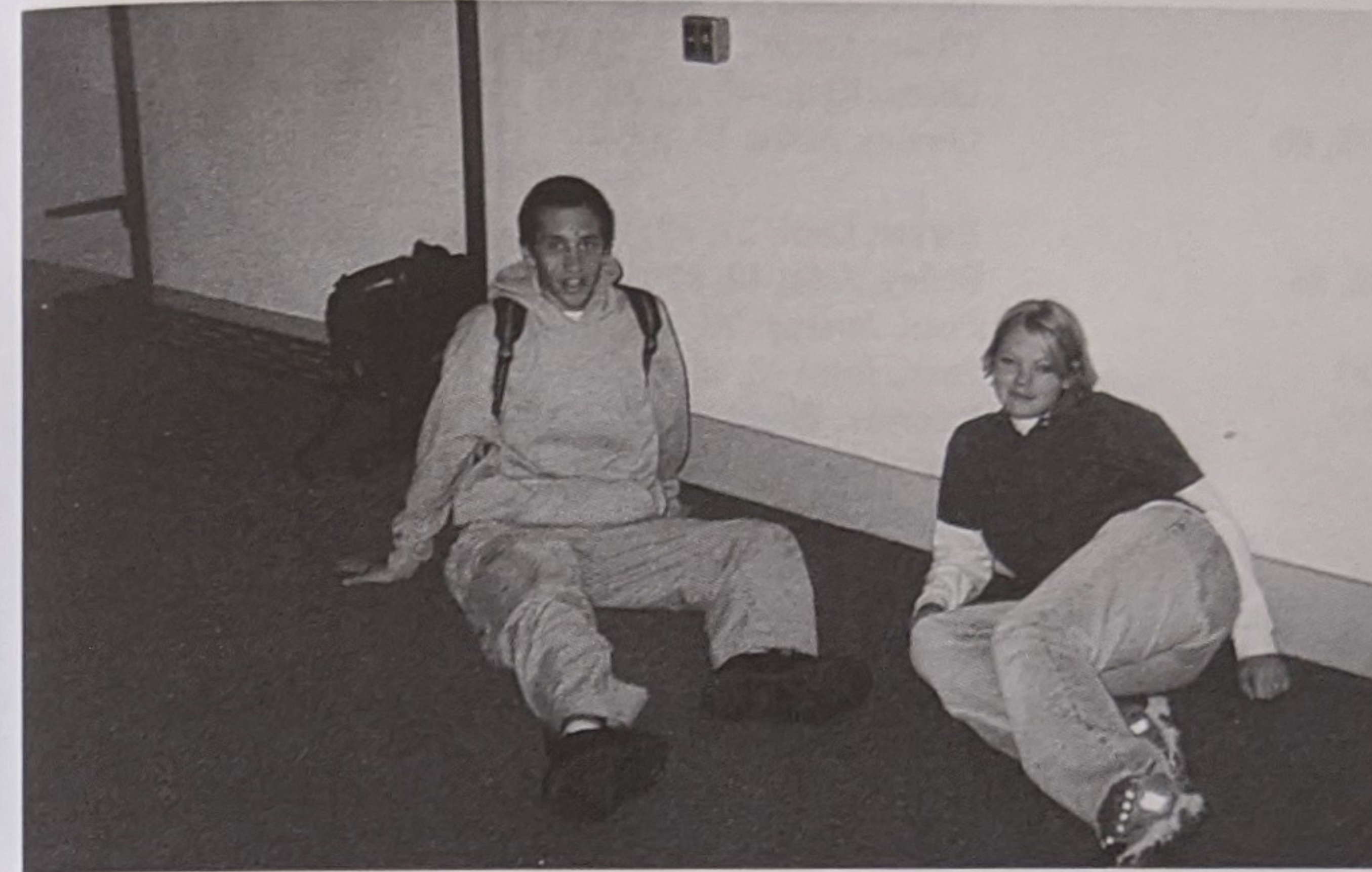
